### **Program Review: Comparison with Other Similar Programs**

Welch College ASB Comparison to Other Colleges

The Business Department compared Welch College's ASB degree to the ASB degrees at Trevecca University, Bryan College, Nashville State Community College, and Volunteer State Community College. After completing the comparison, the ASB degree at Welch College was found to be comparable to all the ASB degrees at the other institutions with the exception of Trevecca University. Trevecca's degree included more hours. With Welch College's Bible requirements and core curriculum requirements, adding more business hours to the ASB is not feasible without significantly increasing the total number of hours in the degree. The Business Department is not recommending any changes to the ASB degree at this time.

We are also in the process of requesting a new Associates degree in Business Technology. This will be primarily computer learning in relation to local business needs. This degree is awaiting approval.
