### **Program Review: Comparison with Other Similar Programs**

Comparing Welch College's Youth and Family Ministry program to like-minded institutions, Boyce College, Toccoa Falls College, Lancaster Bible College, and Johnson University were used for evaluation of our current program. These institutions were chosen due to their relative similarity in size, mission, and organization structure. It is important to note each of these institutions is larger than Welch (Boyce: 1235; Toccoa Falls: 1,200; Lancaster: 1979; Johnson: 1012). Our program is consistent with our like-minded institutions. Concerning total credit hours, our program is currently at 128 hours. Similar institutions require similar credits: Boyce College requires 129 hours, Toccoa Falls College requires 126 hours, Lancaster requires 126, Johnson University requires 122 hours. The courses in the program are generally congruent with other institutions. Whereas some institutions include more general ministry classes in their core program (i.e. Boyce), we have chosen to share that in a "ministry core" with our pastoral program. Further, both Toccoa Falls and Johnson utilize more classes focusing on ministry leadership. Lancaster's program has a higher emphasis on psychological and sociological issues. Where courses are similar between Welch and similar institutions, course content is consistent as well. Program objectives are congruent among all institutions.

### Program Review: Analysis of Graduate School/Vocational Requirements

Vocational requirements are immediately met for those interested in ministering to youth within the Free Will Baptist denomination. Placement within churches has been increased and utilized consistently within previous years.

To assess graduate school requirements, I surveyed Huntington University's M.A. in Global Youth Ministry, Campbell University's M.A. in Christian Ministry (concentration in Youth Ministry), Dallas Baptist University's M.A. in Student Ministry, and Southern Baptist Theological Seminary's M.A. in Discipleship and Family Ministry. Each degree had a minimum GPA required, the lowest being a 2.5 through Campbell. Also, the graduate schools were relatively consistent with their class requirements. DBU had prerequisites including: Old Testament Survey or Old Testament Literature & Interpretation, New Testament Survey or New Testament Literature & Interpretation, and a 3000/4000 Level Religion Course or 5000/6000 Level Theology Course. Similarly, Huntington requires 6 credit hours of coursework in Biblical studies, including both Old Testament and New Testament, as well as 3 credit hours of coursework in theology. Concerning both of these institutions, our students are well qualified to meet these requirements.

Further, the graduates from this program have often been put at advance standing in graduate schools due to their significant work in Bible and theology.
